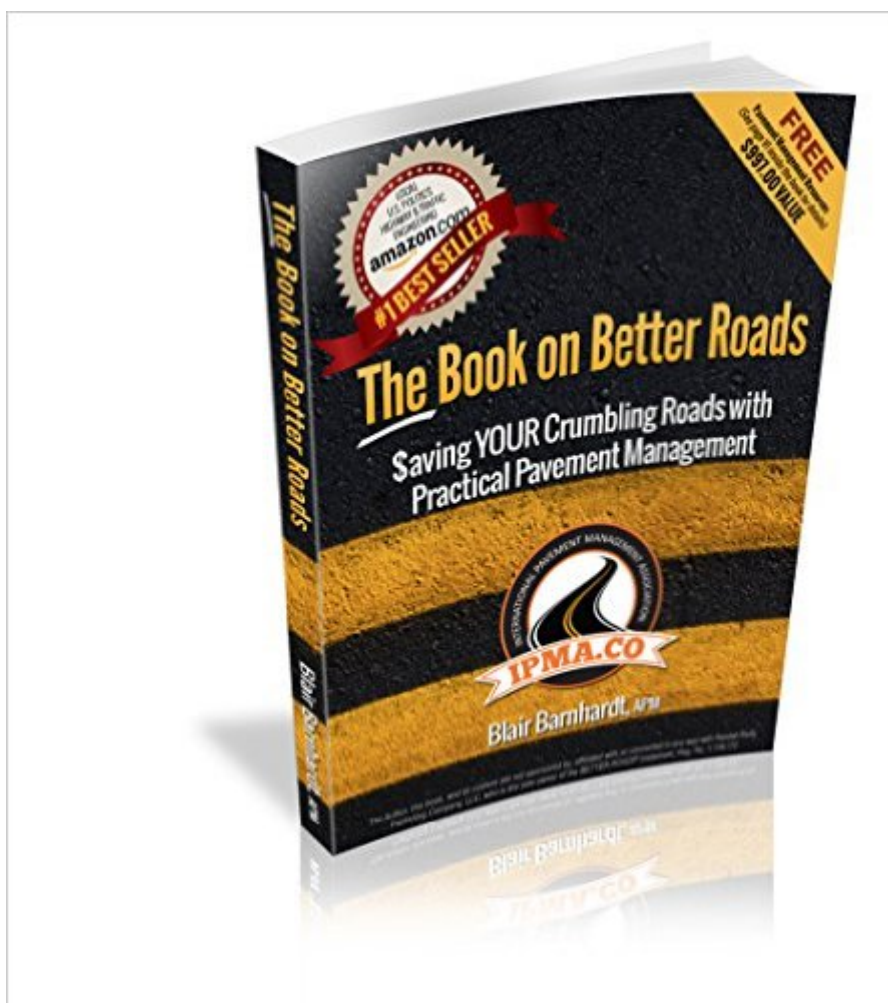


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The Book On Better Roads: How To Save Your Crumbling Roads With Practical Pavement Management
